




Licensing of Professional Geologists in Washington State and an Overview of Department of Ecology's Office of Columbia River

G. Thomas Tebb will be speaking on the status of geology licensing and the Department of Ecology's programs for the Columbia River. Mr. Tebb is the Chair of the WA State Geology Licensing Board, and also is the Director of the Department of Ecology's Columbia River office, which oversees water supply projects along the Columbia that are essential to farmers, residents, tribes and the environment of the region. He is a geologist and hydrogeologist who joined Ecology's Nuclear Waste Program in Richland in 1992.
